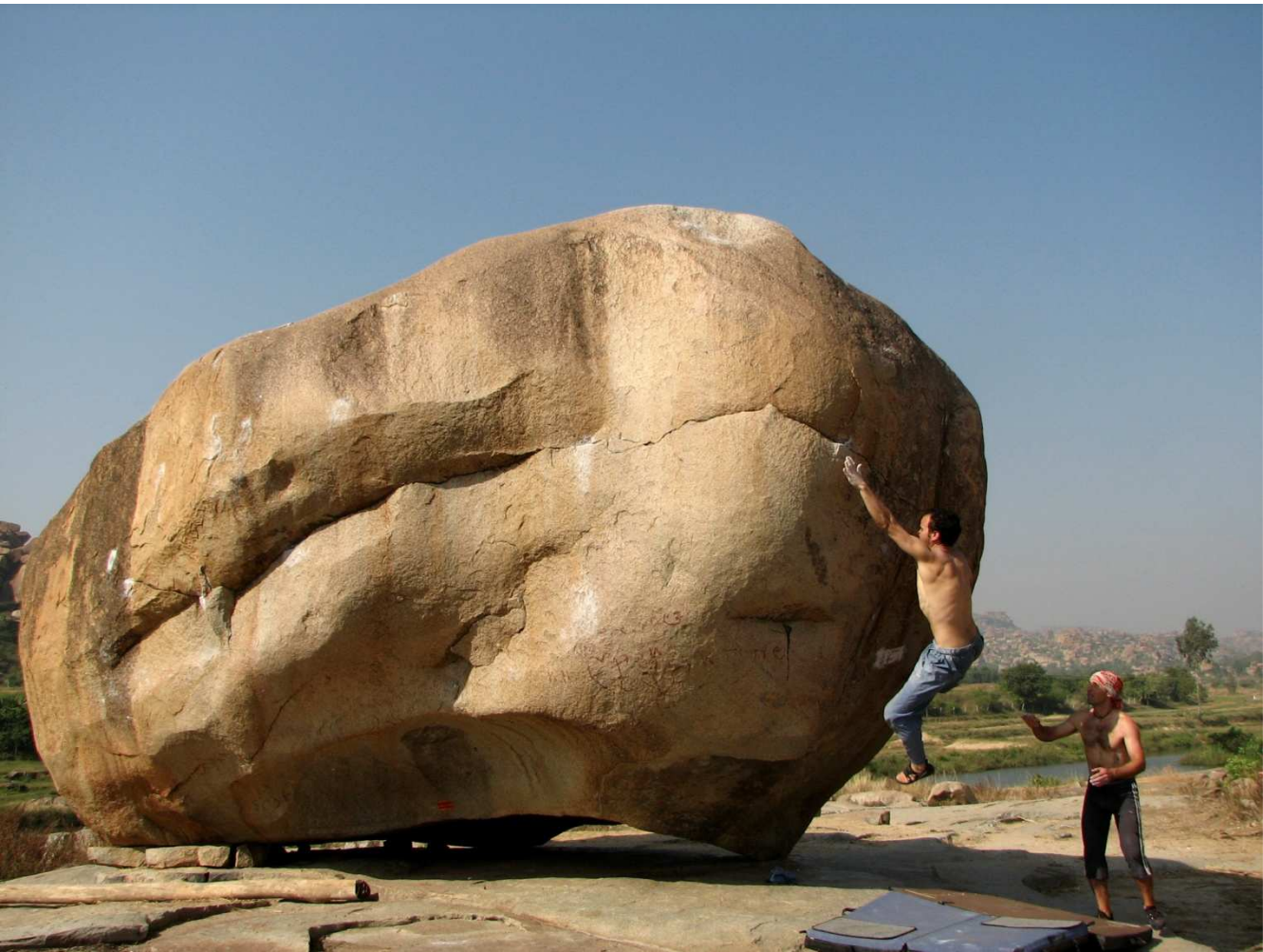

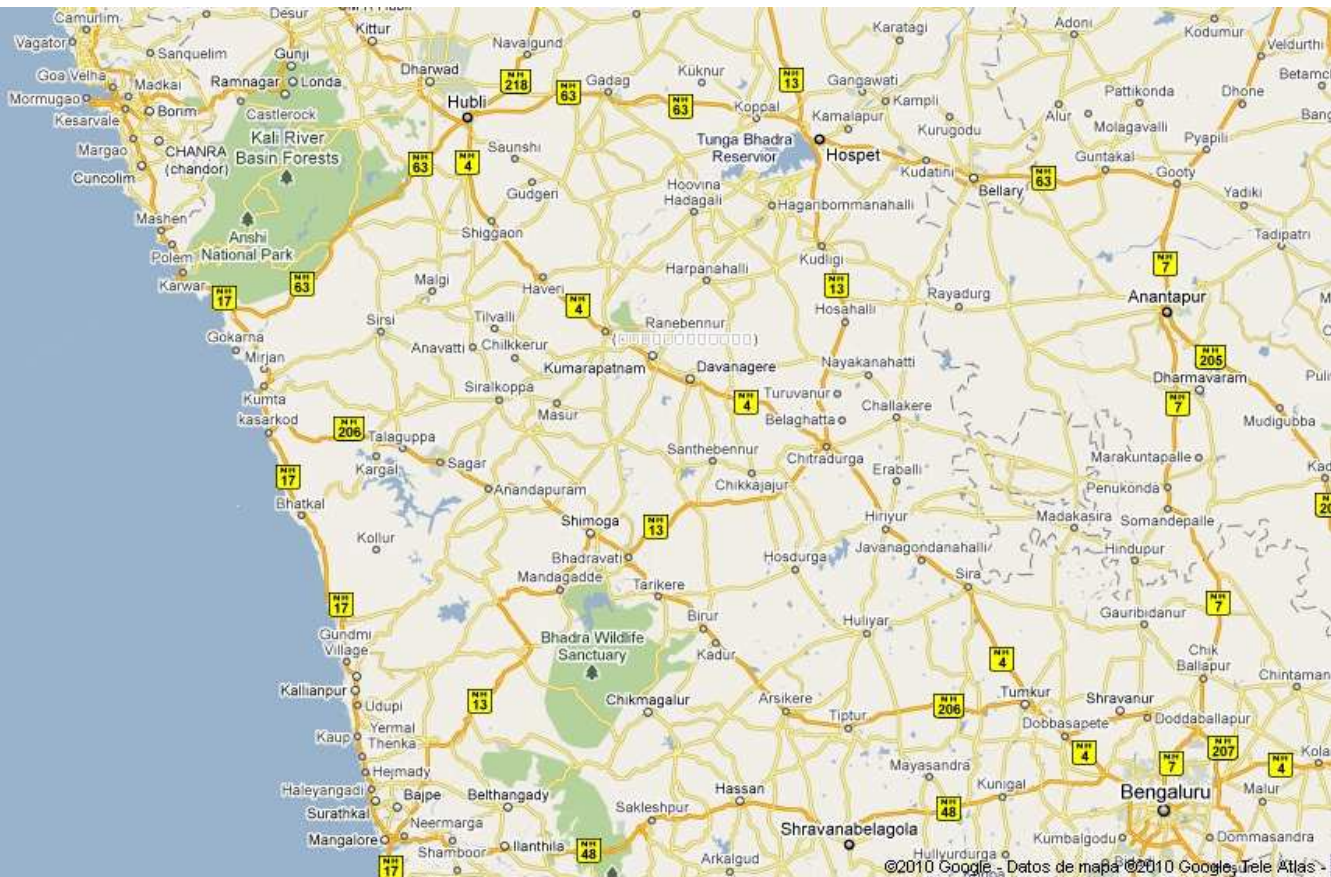

General Information

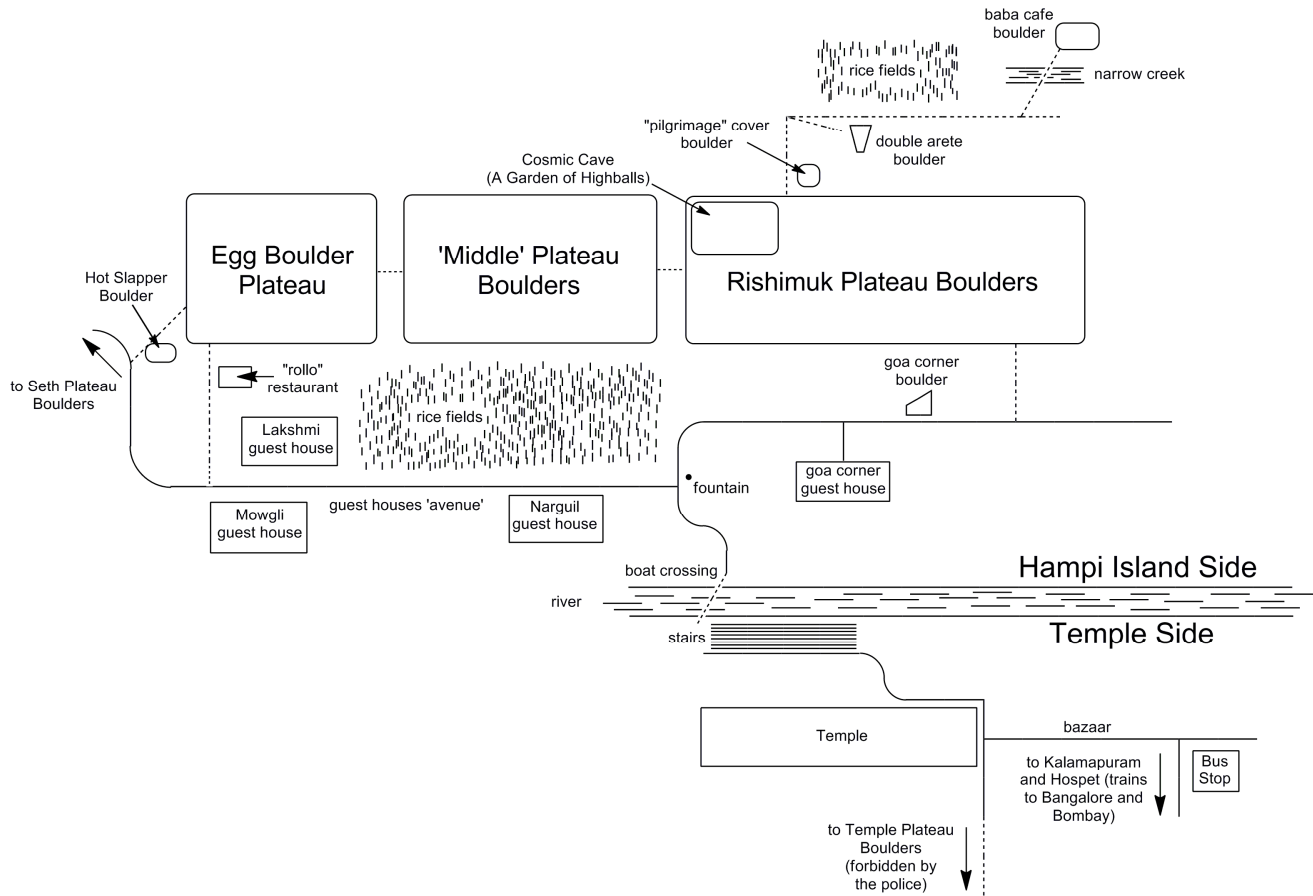
How to get there

Hampi is located in South India, about 350km NW of Bangalore, in the state of Karnataka. Hampi can be accessed from two big cities with international airports: Bombay and Bangalore. Once in the big city, Hampi can be reached by bus, train or taxi. The most comfortable and fast, but also expensive, option is the taxi. Bus is probably the most uncomfortable transportation. A night train is better (get a 2nd class sleeper upper seat) but it's also very slow. In any case, expect very long trips. Our 350km journey from Bangalore to Hampi in a 4WD car with a local driver took 9 hours. The “highway” is full of big holes, some of them big enough to hold a whole car inside. Expect to see people all along the trip, and impressive things like naked monks enrolled in 1000+km walking pilgrimages. Our trip back to Bangalore with train took 10 hours.



Hampi is next to **Kamalapur**, in the vicinity of **Hospet**, at the top-center of the map. This is ~350km NW of **Bangalore**, locally known as **Bengaluru**, at the bottom-right of the map.

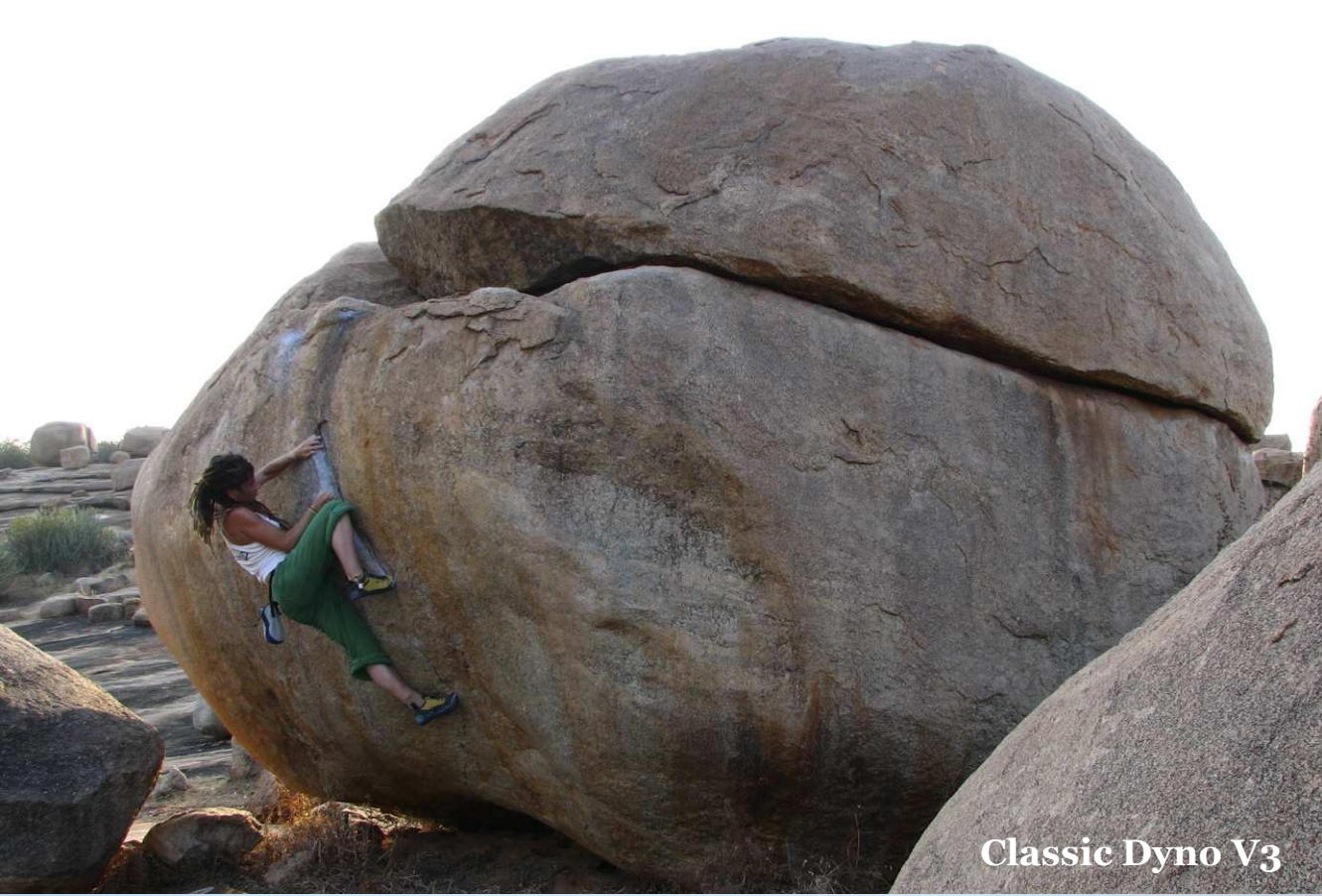
Map of Areas



Hampi is a little holy town divided in two areas by a river. From the towns of Hospet and Kamalapur you will reach the temple side with the bazaar. From there, you can cross the river by boat and get to the other side: Hampi Island. Hundreds of boulders are found on both sides of the river.

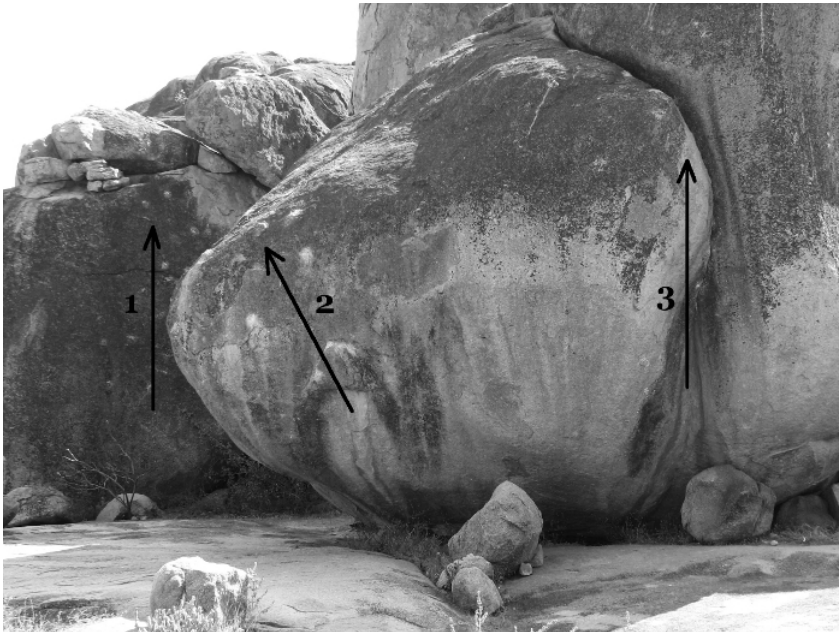


Classic Dyno V3

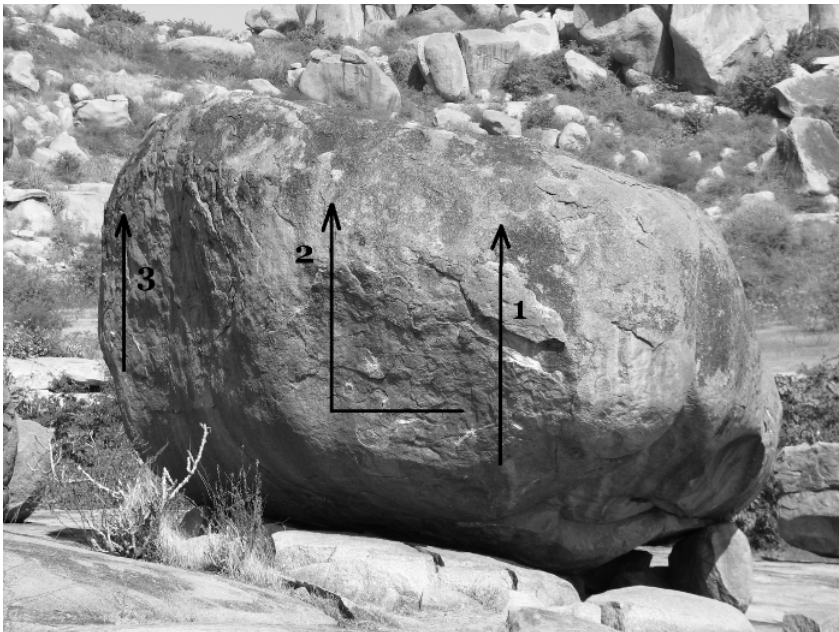




Arete V4
